Dragons Den Comes to Twerton

On Saturday 7th June at **The Centurion**, the community (you!) and some well-known local 'Dragons' will come together to hear about and vote on ideas for community projects. The money that we all raised at **Whiteway Fun Day 2024** (£745) combined with a grant from the Cobalt Trust of £5000, have created a pot of money that can go back out into the community as 'small grants'. This is the first round. Anyone who has an idea for a local project (new or already existing) can apply to pitch it to receive £300 of materials or equipment. Projects will need to show community benefit, and 10 of these projects will be chosen by the community on the day. The kits can stem a severe bleed and help save lives while someone is waiting for the emergency services.
