# Twerton and Whiteway Community Network (TWCN) updates

## Notes of the updates at Southdown Whiteway Church Centre on 25<sup>th</sup> January 2025

#### Bath City FC Foundation update (Chris)

The Foundation is a registered charity and receives no funding from the Football Club. The Foundation currently works with people aged from 3-97 through groups and 'turn up and play for free' sessions. When the weather's good, sessions can be run at Pennyquick Park. Run Walking Football sessions, and now starting Ladies Walking Football - football at a slower pace with no physical contact, good social way to improve fitness. Social inclusion projects such as Reconnecting Twerton for older and socially isolated people, youngest participant is in their early 70s, run at Rose Cottage every Wednesday. Take the group out on visits; last year they went to Swindon Town FC, Cardiff City FC, Forest Green FC, and the new Bristol Zoo project. The Foundation also works in schools and run wellbeing sessions. Starting a walking/jogging session every other Thursday at Odd Down Sports Ground. They work with people to deliver activities that they want to get involved with. The Foundation is holding sessions to help people build digital skills - there's no stupid questions, no age barrier, free to attend, all welcome.

# Twerton and Whiteway Community Network update (Sally and Kate)


The Community Network has built a pot of funding to distribute through 'small grants' of up to £250 to support people who are doing or have an idea for something to support and improve our community. We raised £740 at Whiteway Fun Day and £5,000 has also been donated by the Cobalt Trust to award. The funds will be for local people/groups, not for larger organisations and charities that have the opportunity to apply to other sources of funding. Looking at the best approach, which could be Dragons' Den style events as has been done in Radstock and Westfield for many years now, or could be micro grant application to be considered by a panel of residents, as done in Knowle West in Bristol. There would be clear criteria and a simple, transparent application process for both approaches. At the Dragons' Den style event, people would have the opportunity to pitch their idea, with local friendly 'Dragons' from the community.
